

It made Ahriman very angry to see Gayomard and his people living a happy and peaceful life. So, he sent his soldiers to attack Gayomard and his people.






After a fearful battle, which shook the world, the brave Hoshang defeated Ahriman's army and once again there was peace and joy in the world.








Secretary's Report for March 2001 to March 2002

Good evening and Navroze Mubarak to you all. I will take a few minutes to report ZAGNY's activities during the past year. I begin with congratulations to all our newlyweds, and to children who had their Navjotes. My condolences to families who lost their loved ones and speedy recovery to those that are ill.

June 17th, 2001, will be a day to remember in the history of ZAGNY. We had the grand function of the closing of the old and opening ceremonies of the new Darbe Mehr. It was an emotional day, saying good-bye to our old home in New Rochelle and at the same time a very happy day celebrating the opening of this new Darbe Mehr in Pomona, NY. A farewell Jashan was performed at our New Rochelle Darbe Mehr by 10 priests, led by Ervad Pervez Patel, a tribute given to Arbab Rustam Guiv, a speech was made on the history of the New Rochelle Darbe Mehr by past ZAGNY president, Mr. Erach Munshi. At Pomona, the priests recited the Ataash Ni Niyaesh prayer and the Tao Ahmi prayer - blessings for a new home, led by Dr. Lovji Cama was recited by our religious class students. This function was a total success and for that thanks to each and everyone who worked hard to make it happen.

July 2001, we held the Ivy Gandhi Young Zoroastrian camp at the Pomona Darbe Mehr. Many children along with their parents attended this camp and had a lot of fun. Thanks to Homi and Ellen Byramji and to all the organizers, volunteers and parents for their efforts.

In August we held the Muktad prayers, adult camp and Pateti function. The Muktad prayers were attended by 60 members. Thanks to our priests Darius Antia, Rohinton Madon, Rohinton Dadina and Xerxes Antia.

The Adult Zoroastrian Camp organized by Xerxes Kotval was attended by 20 members between the ages of 16 to 39 and some of them traveled from as far as Philadelphia and Boston. Activities included a short hike in Bear Mountain Park, hilarious afterdinner plays and interesting discussions on issues that challenged us as a member of the Zoroastrian community.

The Pateti function and a Jashan were held at the Pomona Darbe Mehr and was well attended and enjoyed by everyone.

Coming to September 2001, it was a sad month for everyone. A prayer meeting was organized on September 15th and was attended by 100+ members on a very short notice. Our priests recited the Ataash Ni Niyaesh for the departed souls and some of our members, affected by the tragedy talked about their experience and narrow escape from this disaster. At the meeting, everyone was informed about the fund drive initiated by ZAGNY for the victims of the World Trade Center, and thanks to your generosity, we collected \$8,000 which were donated to the Windows of Hope Charity. Another prayer vigil was held in Long Island on October 7th, 2001 organized by several Indian American associations. President Gev Nentin and Ervad Pervez Patel attended this meeting as representatives of ZAGNY.

In October we had a Gahambar Jashan - giving thanks to Ahura Mazda - the prayers in this Jashan included prayers for peace and safety of our Country and New York state, the home of our Darbe Mehr. Ervad Darius Antia led everyone in the recital of "God Bless America". Darius Antia and Lovji Cama spoke a few words on the subject of how Zoroastrians should cope with evil, as explained in our Kem Na Mazda prayer.

In November, the nomination form for the election was mailed out and we have a number of new members who will join the Board, and the good news is that the youth representation has doubled from two to four. I wish the new Board good luck and much success.

In December we had the New Year's Eve function that was attended by 100 + members and everyone had a good time.

Finally, I would like to thank each and every one of you for giving me the opportunity to serve the community for the past 8 years. I enjoyed working with ZAGNY and IZA board members and with the trustees of DMZT.
