ZAGNY ACKNOWLEDGES DARBE MEHR DONORS

On October 6, 2002 Town of Ramapo officials and the ZAGNY community gathered at the Darbe Mehr for the unveiling of the Donor Plaque which recognized those who contributed, in various ways, towards the acquisition of the Pomona Darbe Mehr.

The event began with an Opening Prayer which was led by **Ervads Darius Antia** and **Pervez Patel**. The English translations of the Gatha Prayers were read by. **Lovji Cama** and **Fali Shroff**. Those in attendance were welcomed by **Gev Nentin**. Mr. Nentin spoke of the many campaigns in the past to find a new home for the Greater New York Zoroastrian community. However, the last project was different because a special body, Z-Land LLC, was formed to collect donations specifically towards this project rather than working with the general community funds. Through Z-Land, the Town of Pomona was selected because it is known to be welcoming to communities of varied dominations.

Various community members made presentations on Zoroastrian history to the audience. Although **Professor Kaikhosrov D. Irani** was unable to be with us, **Mehru Cama** read his speech on *The Vision of Zarathushtra*. **Shirin Kiamanesh** acknowledged the contributions of those who were instrumental in acquiring the Pomona Darbe Mehr, and the initial donation of Mr. & Mrs. Guiv for the New Rochelle Darbe Mehr. She also introduced **Anahaita Kotval** and acknowledged her enormous effort in raising the funds for this project. Ms. Kotval spoke of the historical contributions of Zoroastrians.

To acknowledge the participation of our youth members at the Papeti function, certificates of achievement were presented by ZAGNY Board Members, to **Neville Commissariat** and **Rohan Arcot**, for their outstanding readings of the meaning of Muktad and the story of Zal and Rudabeh from Shah-Nama.

ONE WEEK: TWO MAJOR PARSI ZOROASTRIAN AUTHORS


internationally-acclaimed Parsi Zoroastrian writers - Bapsi Sidhwa and Rohinton Mistry appeared in New York during the same week to launch their new books. Sidhwa is Pakistani American and Mistry is Indian Canadian but both write about the Parsi community.

Sidhwa's well-attended event was hosted by the Indocenter of Art & Culture. Sidhwa read from her essay in To Mend The World: Women Reflect On 9/11. The piece begins "I am Zoroastrian" - and reflects on history, foreign policy, and national memory. The book which includes essays by other renowned authors is the first collection dedicated to women's perspectives on 9/11.

Rohinton Mistry's huge sold-out event at the Asia Society launched the US publication and first US tour stop of his new novel, Family Matters - and coincidentally came the day after Mistry was nominated for the esteemed Booker Prize. Mistry read from, and answered questions about Family Matters, a novel about a struggling Parsi family caring for an aging and ailing father. The photograph on the book's cover was taken by Sooni Taraporevala. The reading, co-sponsored by the South Asian Journalists Association (SAJA), was extremely well attended by area Zoroastrians - all of whom spoke with a delighted Mistry at the reception afterwards.

FEZANA AT THE UNITED NATIONS

A team of five Zoroastrian youth consisting of Tenaz Dubash, Susan Karani, Mitra Mehr, Jehan Panthaki, and Mehr Pastakia form Chicago, New York, and Washington DC participated with Behram Pastakia and myself at the 55th Annual DPI/NGO Conference entitled "Rebuilding Societies Emerging from Conflict: A Shared Responsibility," held at the United Nations in New York City, on September 9-11, 2002. FEZANA acquired NGO status over 4 years ago. The Conference was attended by more than 700 NGOs with over 2,500 representatives from more than 80 countries.

The Conference was opened by **Shashi Tharoor**, UN Under Secretary-General for Communications & Public Information, and was then addressed by **Han Seung-soo**, President of the 56th Session of the UN General Assembly; **Louise Frechette**, UN Deputy Secretary-General; and **Mary Robinson**, UN High Commissioner for Human Rights and a former President of Ireland. **Donald Treimann**, Chair of the NGO/DPI Executive Committee, and **Sherrill Kazan Alvarez de Toledo**, Conference Chair, set the tone of the Conference in their opening remarks by highlighting the role that each of us can play in bringing happiness, peace, and prosperity to our extended human family.

Our team participated in most of the workshops, made many contacts, and even met with some Zoroastrians who work at the UN & its agencies; Rosy and Jimmy Rustomji (UNICEF) and Nosh Nalavala (UNDP). Behram and I wore Daglis on the first and the last day of the Conference. This opened many opportunities for dialogue with other participants at the Conference who came to us with a desire to know more about our heritage. Some of them were quite surprised to hear that Zoroastrianism was still a living religion, practiced by people in many parts of the world. Among those interested in learning more about us were Kofi Annan, UN Secretary General and Shashi Tharoor with whom we exchanged pleasantries at the evening reception. The Federation of World Peace and Love invited us to participate in the ceremony of ringing the Bell of Peace. We were also invited to walk in the procession at the annual Interfaith Service of Commitment to the work of the UN at St. Bartholomew's Church on September 11, 2002. This service was to mark the opening of the 57th Session of the UN General Assembly and a Celebration of Remembrance and Hope, dedicated to the Victims of Violence Everywhere. Our Mobed **Pervez Patel** performed the Zoroastrian Prayer at the Service.

ZAGNY'S NEW WEBSITE

On September 25, 2002, (Roj Tir, Mah Ardibehesht of the Holy Year 1372 Y.Z.), the new ZAGNY website went on-line for the very first time.

Accessible at www.zagny.org, the ZAGNY website is currently evolving and has some menu items under construction. Viewing it using Internet Explorer (version 4 and up) or Netscape (version 4 and up) will provide the best audio-visual experience. You may find several items of interest as you tour the website, including information about the ZAGNY Board and its mission, an archive of ZAGNY newsletters, ZAGNY greeting cards, a calendar of ZAGNY events, various bulletin boards on the Zoroastrian religion, Parsi and Iranian recipes, and a guest book, in which we invite you to write your comments. Some of the more popularly demanded items are explained in greater detail below.

The **GREETING CARD** link provides a wide array of greeting cards for sixteen occasions. Greeting cards with Zarathushti themes will be available soon. The cards can be sent to multiple recipients at one time. The website offers a wide variety of musical selections and a multitude of great special effects like waves, ripples, snow, fireworks, etc. which may be included with the cards. Viewing the "Java Card Demo" will allow you to explore the magic of greeting cards!

The **PERPETUAL ZAGNY CALENDAR** will allow you to view all ZAGNY sponsored functions and events. The Calendar can be customized in various formats to suit your interests. If you wish to enter an event/function into the Calendar, please email the webmaster at fall: shroff@zagny.org. After consideration by the Board, the event may be added on the Calendar.

The website also offers ten **ZAGNY BULLETIN BOARDS**. These include: Board's Bulletin, Members Bulletin, Business Help, Jobs Help, Family Help, Donation Help, Condolence Help, Urgent Help, General Help, and Medical Help. While we welcome all entries on these bulletin boards, we request that they be limited to about two paragraphs of about four lines each. Each entry will remain on-line for 12 weeks after which it shall be purged. Since space on the web is expensive, any entry violating the limits will be deleted.

The **Z-RELIGION** web-page currently contains our Avestan prayers. In the coming months, we will add other items pertaining to the Zoroastrian Religion in this space.

The **Z-RECIPES** web-page provides recipes for mouth watering Parsi and Iranian dishes. Although we already have some recipes from ZAGNY's Sheroo Kanga, we welcome more submissions.

In addition, you can access Search Engines, Weather Info, Yahoo (Customize My Yahoo as well), Maps Directions, News Portal, Email Sites (currently Hotmail and Yahoo), World-Wide Links, and Humor/Jokes from the ZAGNY website. Send us your email and ISP and we will incorporate them into our ZAGNY Website. Check out our News Portal where you can customize your News as well as Stocks, Horoscopes, Sports etc.

Finally, at the end of your tour please remember to tell us your impressions by signing in the ZAGNY **GUEST BOOK**. Please remember to sign your entries as anonymous entries will be deleted.

The historical presentation on Zoroastrianism was closed with an audio – visual presentation developed by Mr. Shroff which provided a pictorial history of the Persian Empire while Iranian music played in the background. The effort it took to develop this presentation was well appreciated by the crowd who clapped along with the traditional music.

Toos Daruvala reflected on the collective achievements of the ZAGNY community in acquiring the Darbe Mehr property; once the Pomona property was found, there were only 30 days to raise \$1,200,000 USD. The property offered the flexibility and potential to evolve. The goal was met and surpassed because the community mobilized behind this effort. The fundraising goal was supported by donations of money and time, made by 150 families, numerous youth members and Zoroastrians living outside the tri-state area. Also, funds were raised by means of a penny jars and silent auctions.

The efforts of the following individuals deserve special mention:

- Momi and Ellen Byramji for the single largest donation from the tri-state community;
- **Gev Nentin** for providing balanced and thoughtful leadership during the process;
- Members of Z-Land for being early visionary donors;

- Mahaita Kotval, Jasmin Kotwal and Mehru Cama for the time and effort for this project;
- The community at large because of the legacy we have left for our children and grandchildren.

The Town Clerk of Pomona, **Chris Sampson**, welcomed ZAGNY to the Town of Pomona. **Homi Gandhi** then invited the crowd to view the unveiling of the plaque by Mr. Nentin.

We appreciate the enormous amount of effort from so many to meet the challenge of obtaining our new home. Similarly, we acknowledge the work of those that organized and contributed towards the Open House event. The community should be proud of these achievements.

ZOROASTRIAN FAMILY TAKES PART IN INTERFAITH SERVICE

On September 11, 2002, Lovji Cama represented the Zoroastrian religion at an interfaith service called "Remembering and Rebuilding: Sharing Memory and Hope as People of Faith". The service was held in Tenafly, New Jersey to honor the victims of a year ago.

The service had three parts including remembrance and mourning, acceptance and healing and finally, hope. Fifteen individuals representing different religions and denominations marched in procession to begin the service. Four individuals representing Christian, Jewish, Muslim and Zoroastrian religions lit a candle of Hope and Peace. This was followed by readings from sacred texts. Mr. Cama recited the Kemna Mazda prayer, and translated it in English for the benefit of other participants in the service. Mr. Cama chose to recite Kemna Mazda because it teaches Zoroastrians how to deal with evil.

We thank the Cama family for its dedication to creating awareness of Zoroastrianism and building bridges with other communities by participating in interfaith activities.
