FORMATION OF AN INTERMARRIED ZARATHUSTHI GROUP

We live in an open secular society good percentage Zarathushtis have intermarried. Many of these intermarried couples have shown a willingness to continue practicing the faith and participating in ZAGNY community activities. However, many others have gradually weaned awav from community activities and some have even lost all contact with other Zarathushtis.

Times have changed and several other religious organizations have successfully instituted interfaith groups to keep intermarried couples and their children in the community. Thus, ZAGNY announces the formation of an Intermarried Zarathushti group.

The goal of the intermarried group is to facilitate a dialogue in an open forum with a focus on forming friendships and building on community. The group will meet once a month at the Darbe-Mehr for an open discussion and exchange of views on social, cultural and religious issues that affect the participants. This will be done with respect and with an aim developing towards а greater understanding of other faiths and cultures.

Our hope is to build bridges of understanding and encourage these couples to get more involved in community activities. The program and activities can be self-directed by the group themselves to create a fun and friendly atmosphere. Group discussions will be facilitated with leadership participation from intermarried couples who are already

active in the community. As we learn more about their needs, ZAGNY can then provide other guidance and support programs for the couples who choose to raise their children in the Zarathushti faith.

An invitation letter with a survey will be sent out soon to the intermarried couples who are listed in the ZAGNY directory to learn more about their interests and forming a program to their liking.

We want your support in 3 ways:

- 1) If you are intermarried please send us your comments, encouragement and suggestions.
- 2) If you know of any intermarried Zarathushti couples who are not listed in the directory, please send us their contact information.
- 3) The success of this program depends on the encouragement from family and friends to encourage participation in this program, so please encourage your intermarried family members to participate.

Usheen and Ushtavaity Davar met the Kolah family at their temporary residence, the Ronald McDonald House. Nazneen is much like any other child meeting 2 strangers; a bit shy, but adorable. On Friday, November 1, 2002, brave Nazneen underwent a 7 hour surgery to remove a tumor.

The Kolah's have asked the Davars to convey their heartfelt gratitude to all those that have lent them a hand over the past few months. "It is heartwarming for to see a smile on the parents' faces, when a few days ago they were so stricken with anxiety," the Davar sister's said.

Nazneen and her family will most likely return to Helsinki at the end of November so that she can continue with her chemotherapy treatments. Until then, they will be at the Ronald McDonald House, where Nazneen will be recovering and undergoing outpatient services and follow-ups.

MISTRY PROTESTS RACIAL PROFILING



7oroastrian author Rohinton Mistry has cancelled the second leg of his American tour which included appearances in various American cities including Chicago, Boston, San Francisco and Salt Lake City. Mr. Mistry cited being searched at every American airport through which he and his wife.

Freny, traveled as the reason for the cancellation.

"I don't find this is the random check that they talk about, not when they happen to have it at every single stop, every single airport... and when it keeps happening every single time, you get into this convoluted logic, trying to convince yourself about why it's happening. 'Perhaps it's something about my beard, may be I should change my beard'". Mr. Mistry characterized this train of thought as "trying to appease a bad policy".

Many travelers of Middle Eastern and South Asian descent have complained in the past year of being subjected by U.S. authorities to overly rigorous security and possible "racial profiling". Mr. Mistry expressed sympathy for these persons: "I have the luxury of canceling and not going, but there are others who, for various reasons, are condemned to endure this because they... don't have a choice." Mr. Mistry's protest comes on the heels of similar criticism by members of the Canadian government.


CONGRATULATIONS TO THE CHALLENGER

Ayesha Nariman, the first Zarathushti to run for the US Congress lost the election on November 6, 2002 to two term incumbent Republican Tom Reynolds. But Ms. Nariman's race may still be considered a victory. One of three other candidates who ran against an incumbent in a heavily Republican Congressional District (almost 3 registered GOP voters for every 1 democrat). Ms. Nariman still convinced 22% of the voters in her District to vote for her.

Among other challenges Ms. Nariman faced, she received no support - financial or otherwise - from her party. Her largest campaign contribution was a \$500 check she got from someone in Gramercy Park, New York. While Mr. Reynolds spent \$10,000 a day for the campaign, Ms. Nariman ran on a campaign budget of a few thousand dollars, a campaign staff of one and no campaign headquarters other than her own office.

But the challenger, after whose grand-uncle Bombay's Nariman Point takes its name, is unfazed. "Politics here is mostly about money," she says, reeling off views on everything from social security to middle-east policy. "But I am running on ideas." Ms. Nariman believes that the Congressional race is just another lesson in her political schooling.

Congratulations to Ayesha Nariman for running when no one else was willing to and for agreeing to do it again!
