Legend has it that the Jamshedi Navroze celebration dates back to the times of the legendary King of Persia, Jamshed. It is said that King Jamshed introduced solar calculations into the Persian calendar, and therefore set as the beginning of the year the date the sun enters the constellation of Aries. Also, legend has it that on this day King Jamshed forced the demons to carry him on their shoulders from Mount Demavand to Babylon.

This day came to be known as Navroze or Jamshedi Navroze day.

NEW YORK'S ZOROASTRIAN COMMUNITY CELEBRATES UNESCO-DECLARED "3,000TH ANNIVERSARY OF ZOROASTRIAN CULTURE" IN NOVEMBER

November 7-15 marked a rare week of Zoroastrian-related public events, enjoyed by hundreds of ethnically and religiously diverse people. Involving first-ever collaborations with cultural institutions, these included a major IZA and ZAGNY event celebrating the UNESCO-declared "3,000th Anniversary of Zoroastrian Culture;" a theater production at the Asia Society; and a coincidentally-scheduled play reading.

On November 7th and 8th the Asia Society - with IZA and ZAGNY as copresenters, produced "Sohrab and Rustum," a one-man play by actor Zaraawar Mistry, billed one of Minneapolis's "Top 10" productions. The play retells the legend of the fateful battle between the warrior Rustum and his son Sohrab (from the Shahnameh (Book of Kings), the 11th century Persian epic chronicling much Zoroastrian history); weaving it with a story of a contemporary Parsi family in Mumbai - into a performance about loyalty, generational differences, war and migration. Mistry, who directs an arts center in Minneapolis, played a dozen different characters, accompanied by a Persian music ensemble. The show, sold out days before (with discounted tickets for IZA and ZAGNY members), played to over 250 people each night, to standing ovations. The Asia Society's Director of Performing Arts/Public Programs, Rachel Cooper, enthusiastic about this collaboration and looks forward to others.

The next week, the Indo-American Arts Council and Lark Theatre coincidentally presented readings of "Feroza Among the Farangees," a play by Houston-based novelist Bapsi Sidhwa, based on her novel *An American Brat* and its recent London production.

On November 15, over 350 people attended IZA and ZAGNY's public event, "History, Beliefs, and the Influence of Zoroastrianism on Other Cultures" (cosponsored by Asia Society, and CUNY's Middle East & Middle Eastern American Center), hosted at the Metropolitan Hotel in Manhattan, through gracious arrangement with manager Sam Bhadha.

Attendees were greeted by volunteers in traditional Parsi and Iranian outfits, offering rosewater and mirror reflection (an Iranian welcoming gesture); Parsi "toran"and flowers, compliments of Elegant Affairs; and Iranian and Parsi ("ses") trays. The entrance featured a Zoroastrian book display table, organized by Aysha Ghadiali with Jamshed and

Yasmin Ghadiali, with a huge assortment – from coffee table, to fiction, to cookbooks; displays of quotations by Zoroastrian authors such as Rohinton Mistry, Bapsi Sidhwa (who attended the event), and others; and a printed booklist.

The program brochure included excerpts from a "3000th Anniversary" message by Koïchiro Matsuura, UNESCO's Director-General, originally published in HAMAZOR, the World Zoroastrian Organisation's journal; a special letter from Shashi Tharoor, United Nations Under-Secretary General for Communications and Public Information; and messages from Minoo Shroff, Chairman of the Bombay Parsi Panchayet; and Dinshaw Tamboly, Chairman of the World Zoroastrian Organisation Trust in India.

The onstage events occurred against a Persepolis backdrop mural by Dolly and Freddy Khambatta, specially commissioned by Sam Bhadha. Opening prayers (by Ervads Darius Antia, Rohinton Madon, Karl Khambatta, and Burgese Turel) began the event; followed by spoken English translations by Mitra Mehr and Kayhan Irani. ZAGNY president Homi Gandhi and IZA president Shirin Kiamanesh (Kiamanesh remarks welcoming translating into Persian). Gandhi noted special academic, religious, and diplomatic guests; and read aloud the congratulatory letter by the UN's Shashi Tharoor. Gandhi introduced His Excellency Rashid Alimov, Tajikistan Ambassador to the United Nations, and Sayu S. Bhojwani, Commissioner, Mayor's Office of Immigrant Affairs, who made remarks (Seema Singh, Ratepayer Advocate for the State of New Jersey, was also scheduled, but unable to attend). Alimov spoke about Zoroastrianism's importance in Central Asia and a changing world; Bhojwani said, "Without you [the Zoroastrian community], New York would not be the New York it is today."

The main speakers, on Zoroastrianism's influence on other major religions and cultures, were New York's own Professor Kaikhosrov D. Irani, CUNY philosophy professor emeritus of philosophies were recently produced into "Domains of Belief," a DVD for sale); and Dr. Farhang Mehr, Boston University professor emeritus international relations, and former deputy prime minister of Iran. Professor Irani spoke on Zarathustra's innovations in Indo-European cultures

and showed how various Zoroastrian tenets, such as personal responsibility for one's actions, can also be viewed in context of contemporary philosophies. He also mentioned Zoroastrianism's sense of morality, and the need to speak out against social injustice. Dr. Mehr spoke eloquently on the history of Zoroastrian thought and culture, and its influence on the practices and beliefs of other cultures and religions, both during and after the Persian empires.

Following was a short, highly popular video on Zoroastrianism, professionally produced for the event by Kaizad Bhabha and Thomas Jackson of 2B Productions (who also arranged for and handled the event's entire sound and lighting).

The finale, a fashion showcase directed by Tanaz Parmar, featured traditional and modern Iranian and Parsi attire. Narrated by husband-and-wife team Tanaz Dutia and Michel Reid, and featuring models of diverse ages and genders, it resulted from considerable research and rehearsal by Parmar and her volunteer team. The event ended with closing remarks by Gev Nentin, and Tamina Davar; and a reception of Iranian and Parsi food catered by the Metropolitan's (Parsi) chef, Burzis Thunti.

During the event Susan Karani was presented with the FEZANA Scholarship check of \$2,000 by Framroze Patel.

Attended by journalists, the event was featured in New York Newsday; The Iranian (which will feature a future full-length article); in full-page spreads in India Abroad, and News India-Times (and cover story in their free weekly, Desi-Talk); and on TV Asia, broadcast throughout North America.

Organization of the November 15 event – and promotion of both official events – was handled by a committee (Homi Gandhi, Gev Nentin, Mehru Cama, Tamina Davar, Aysha Ghadiali, Suzie Karani, Shirin Kiamanesh, and Framroze Patel), over several months – but the process, and the events themselves could not have been so successful without the strong help of numerous wonderful volunteers (listed in the event program) who devoted hours of their time, energy, and wishes.

Both public events (and the play reading) attracted peoples of diverse backgrounds – including Zoroastrians attending a community event for the first time, thrilled at their warm welcome. Many expressed excitement about 3000th Anniversary celebrations elsewhere, and looked forward to future New York Zoroastrian public events.
