### IRAN'S CELEBRATIONS OF 3000TH ANNIVERSARY OF ZOROASTRIAN CULTURE WRITTEN BY: HOMI GANDHI

It all began with an afternoon phone call on 20<sup>th</sup> November 2003. At the other end was Dr. Meherbanoo Bakhtiyari inviting me on behalf of Dr. Rostam Abadian, President, Zarthoshti Anjuman of Tehran, for the Iranian Celebrations on December 11<sup>th</sup> & 12<sup>th</sup>, 2003 in Teheran (normally Thursday/Friday is a weekend in Iran). I was quite taken aback as a direct phone call from Tehran was the last thing I was expecting on that day. conveyed all the imminent problems I could visualize at that time—difficulty in getting visa, air reservations, leave from work, etc. but Meherbanoo was insistent in getting my yes answer. We concluded our phone call after Meherbanoo obtained a promise from me to consider the invitation and respond in affirmative as soon as possible. After communicating the messages to Firdosh Mehta, FEZANA President, Rivetna, and other leaders in the community and receiving further faxes, telephone calls and emails from Iran over the next few days, I decided to visit Tehran, provided the Iranian visa came in time. Even though the first snow blizzard of the winter blanketed the Northeast on the first weekend in December, I managed to get back my Passport from the Iranian Visa Section of the Pakistan Embassy on late Saturday afternoon on December 6<sup>th</sup>.

On December 10<sup>th</sup>, I arrived at the Meherabad airport in Tehran; I find a man with a big placard welcoming me and a lady came forward to welcome me with a bunch of tube roses and mini marigolds in her hand. Fahim & Mahnaz Bakhtiyani had come to receive me with Perween. Fahim works 1200 kilometers away in Bander Abbas in oil drilling business and comes home once every 2-3 weeks. As the luck would have it, this was the weekend he had come, as he would also attend the celebrations. Mahnaz is a housewife and attends many important meetings of the community affairs besides managing the household. Their elder son is on military duty, which is compulsory for any male between 20-36 for a period of 2-3 years. Their daughter studies at a university in Pune, India. Mahnaz was born in Mumbai but came to Iran at a very early age. They drove me down to Laleh International Hotel, one of the few five-star hotels in the city.

December 11<sup>th</sup> function was at the Ferdowsi Hall, School of Literature, Tehran University. The morning session began with a short prayer and the Orchestra playing and the Chorus singing "Ashem Vohu". This was followed by the opening message from Dr. Kahrooby, Head of the Islamic Iranian Parliament, and responded by the minority Majlis (Parliament) member, Dr. Dabestani. After that I

was invited to address the gathering as the main guest speaker. After that Dr. Kersi Antia from Chicago addressed the gathering. The traditional prayer ceremony opened the sessions which included cultural program of Folklore dances and traditional music.

It also included speeches from various University scholars & Mobeds from Tehran, Yazd, & Kerman. In between, a sumptuous lunch was served at the University Dining Hall. Many other scholars & well-wishers participated in the afternoon session as well. The hall was choc-o-full, with an estimated crowd of over 1,000 people. Simultaneous Farsi/English and English/Farsi translation were available. Diplomatic crowd was well represented, which included among others Ambassadors from Austria, China, France, and Germany. The closing ceremony followed, after which local press interviewed me in the evening on my impressions and other related Zoroastrian subjects.

The December 12<sup>th</sup>, function began at the Zarthoshti Anjuman's Hall with "Baaj" prayers by 3 priests. Tradition is to pray by sitting on the chair & putting all items on the table facing the crowd. After the prayers, Dr. Abtahi, Deputy Prime Minister in charge of Minorities Discourse and Culture, addressed the crowd, responded by Dr. Dabestani & the Head Priest from Tehran.



After lunch and prayers at the Dare Mehr, which is attached to the Hall, there were video presentations on the various sites in Iran and then awards were presented to all outstanding students. After tea, there was a cultural program in the Main Hall, where French Ambassador also addressed the crowd. It was once again a standing room only event, attended by almost a thousand people. The program ended with the recitation of poetry by Tooran Shahriari Bahrami.

This was a very short and quickly arranged visit for me to Iran. I wish that I had more time to plan the visit and see many historic sites. However, I was happy that I participated in the Iranian 3000th Anniversary celebrations. And, there is always the next time in future to explore those memorable sites of Iran.

Other unseen, characters like the abandoning families, dishonest business partners and the other eccentric geriatrics all are discussed and dismissed. All this does not reflect the protagonists' old age goodliness. In fact it presents them at time, in a rather cruel and honest light. It makes them more human. The play has a lot of questions that creep up on you subtly, spurring nagging questions that won't go away. -.

#### FLORIDA ACTIVE RETIREMENT COMMUNITY PROJECT Provided by Yasmin Kevala

This project has been presented at the FEZANA AGM in 2003 and in an article in the Fall 2003 FEZANA Journal. She does not have license in real estate and does not make any profit from this project. Her purpose is to encourage Zoroastrians to start taking positive steps to form suitable retirement communities. She will be at the Pomona Darbe Mehr on April 4<sup>th</sup> at 2:30 PM.

The Retirement Community is in Sun City Center, Tampa, Florida and it provides safe, secure and inexpensive living conditions for people 55 and over. Excellent medical facilities, access to airports and salubrious climate are of course there year round. There are three types of residents there – retirees, "snowbirds" who come to Florida every winter, and a few who are working. Many Canadians and Europeans also own homes there for winter use. Many travel, take cruises, or visit relatives during the summer months. Because of the 24-hour security patrols, year-round grounds maintenance and friendly neighbors, it is quite safe to leave the homes empty for long periods. Some of course may rent out the homes when they are not there.

Tampa Bay- Orlando area has about 30 Zarathushti families who recently formed the Zoroastrian Association of Tampa Bay (ZTAMBAY). As you may know, ZTAMAY will be hosting the next FEZANA AGM in Tampa on May 29<sup>th</sup>-30<sup>th</sup>, 2004. You will get to see the entire 5,000-acre community, model homes, and pre-owned homes if you wish. We will visit Mira Bay, Apollo Beach, Brandon and Sarasota. WCI Communities (Sun City Center developers) representative Ron Cress and my associate, Joy Sparkman who has an office in Brandon, will be available to answer your questions about the area, prices and facilities. Sun City Center offers a Preferred Guest program, under which a family can stay for 3 nights for \$109 or \$39 per night for shorter stays. This includes breakfast and use of Sun City Center facilities: exercise rooms, swimming pools, sauna and tennis. Discounted round of golf is available also. If a sufficient number of people sign up to come, WCI will arrange an entertainment night and transportation by bus. This could be a very enjoyable and memorable Memorial Day holiday for the family. Note that at least one family member needs to be over 55 to own a property at SCC, but there is no age restriction in many of the surrounding developments. Even if you are not retiring now, you can get an idea about what is available. Just visit and enjoy.
