PERSIAN PARADE FOR NOWRUZ CELEBRATIONS

In 2003, New York City Mayor Bloomberg issued the proclamation declaring Nowruz Holidays. In 2004, the very first Persian Parade for Nowruz celebrations was held!

Until 2003 no national or city leader had issued a proclamation for this holiday recognizing the diverse communities, which celebrate. And it was a groundbreaking statement about unity and diversity of New York City when all communities celebrating Nowruz Holidays marched on March 27, 2004 on the Madison Avenue.

It was a very colorful parade. Just as the parade was about to commence at 10 o'clock in the morning on that day, the rain showers suddenly stopped and the vibrant colors of the new season came out. There were 14 main floats in the form of Horse-driven carriages, first time such kind of floats has been used. There were many people marching with groups of dancers and music.

There were School Marching Bands.

It was truly a multicultural parade of groups. ethnic **Besides** manv Zoroastrians, the parade included Ghajar, Assyrian, Armenian, Kurds, Belochi, Bakhteyari, Jewish, Azeri, Afghans and Banderi groups. It is estimated that over a thousand persons marched in the parade. After the opening group of Parade Dignitaries, Marching Band. and Historical and Cultural floats of Persia, the First Ethnic Float was the Zoroastrian float.

The ZOROASTRIAN FLOAT included Nariman Deboo carrying the Golden Asho Farohar, followed by banners "Good Thoughts, Good displaying Words. and Good Deeds", Federation of Zoroastrian Associations of North America (FEZANA). A white horse-driven carriage, carrying a person in Mobed dress with 2 young boys and 2 young girls with the insignias in their hands, followed this. THE XIII NORTH AMERICAN CONGRESS December 29, 2004 to January 1, 2005

- Relevance of Zoroastrianism in the 21st Century
- Zoroastrianism in the Internet Age
- Zoroastrian Archaeology and efforts to preserve our heritage
- What we need to do to assure the future of Zoroastrianism in North America
- Inter-faith marriages- a discussion of issues
- The message of the Gathas

Prominent community members, university professors, scholars as well as speakers from different backgrounds and perspectives have been invited to discuss the various topics. There will also be a special focus on topics of interest for the youth.

ENTERTAINMENT: There will be entertainment and activities to suit all age groups, including youth dance, a night of special Persian food and entertainment, and a Gala New Years Eve Dinner-Dance. All events have been reasonably priced for adults and youth to attend and enjoy.

OTHER EVENTS: Entrepreneurs, artists and businesses will have a place to display their wares at the Z-Bazaar. This is an excellent opportunity to reach a large and varied audience.
