WZCC - WILLS & ESTATE PLANNING MEETING Provided By Arnaz Maneckshana

Mr. Michael Rowland, Attorney at Law, was the guest speaker at the WZCC, NY Chapter meeting held on September 19th, at the Darbe Mehr.

Simple techniques to preserve assets and protect wealth from death taxes were discussed. Maximizing on the allowed unified credit and reorganization of jointly held assets are common and effective ways of Estate Planning. He also described the more sophisticated tools of estate planning like gift giving strategies, life insurance trusts and second to die insurance policies. He talked about the importance of preparing three documents, a last will and testament, advanced medical directive (popularly known as living trust) and durable power of attorney. We thank Mr. Rowland for this informational seminar which was simplified in layman terms.

FAITH, FAMILY & FOOD ZOROASTRIANS REPRESENTED IN ROCKLAND COUNTY FAIR

The Zoroastrian Association of Greater New York participated in this year's Rockland County Fair on July 3rd, 2004. The annual fair celebrates diversity in Rockland County by allowing various groups to share their artistic and cultural traditions.

The Rockland County Historical Society sponsors the annual event, and takes pride in making American history come alive through dressed enactments of revolutionary period daily life, as well as a live reading of the full Declaration of Independence in English and Spanish.

ZAGNY's exhibit table included examples and explanations of chalk design, the haft-seen Nowruz table, a ses, traditional gara and embroidered saris, various picture books, a faroher tapestry from Iran, and a short educational video on Zoroastrianism created for the help of the 3000th Anniversary celebration committee by Tamina Daver, Kaizad Bhabha and **Thomas Jackson**. Other exhibitions present were the history and traditions of Mexican piñata making, Ukrainian egg ornamental design and traditional baked cakes, Christian Orthodox Byzantine style painting, and artistic Bali food offerings. The guests were amused throughout the day with Indonesian traditional dances, Haitian drumming and traditional American BBO.

Numerous local families joined in the festivities and many were curious about where our new Darbe Mehr was located and what our history was. While we tried to educate others, we were also educated ourselves by visitors who were extremely knowledgeable in ancient Middle Eastern civilizations. Special thanks to Homi Gandhi for helping us get in touch with the organizers, Sheroo and Vispi Kanga and the **Ghadiali Family** for organizing and preparing the exhibit table and greeting the visitors, and all ZAGNY members who were able to come out and support the event. In a post-9.11 world, it is more important than ever that we educate, and be educated mutually. It is the only way we will be able to find the underlying similarities in all of us. From the looks of the exhibits at the fair we should never underestimate the extreme universal power of faith, family and food in every culture and language. The Rockland Historical Society requested a book about Zoroastrianism for their library, and one will be donated for their permanent collection. Zoroastrians are now part of the history of Rockland County.


