NEW BOARD ELECTIONS Sat., March 22nd

In March 2008, the three-year term of the current ZAGNY board will come to an end and a new board will be elected at the Navrooz function on March 22nd. On page 6 of this newsletter is the absentee/mail ballot showing names of the nominees standing for election for various positions. On the day of the election you will have the opportunity to hear from each of the candidates and to vote for them in person. If you are unable to attend the meeting in person, you may use the attached ballots to vote by mail, following the procedure given below:

1. Only dues paying adult members of ZAGNY are eligible to vote.

- 2.Please send your membership dues with the enclosed membership form to Minoo Bengali, if you have not already done so.
- 3.Each adult (18 years old) member has one vote, with up to two votes per family membership. (Reminder—Non Zoroastrian spouses of Zoroastrian members are full voting members and are encouraged to vote).
- **4.IMPORTANT:** Please fill out the absentee/mail ballot, seal it in an envelope with the names and addresses of the voting members written on the outside left corner of the envelope and mail it to **Khursheed P. Navder**, 74 Two Bridges Road, Towaco, NJ 07082, postmarked no later than March 10th, 2008. Unnamed envelopes will be disqualified.

Note: If you vote by mail and are present at the election, you may revoke your mailed ballot and vote in person.

RELIGION AND DAILY LIFE

Talk by Keki Dadachanji

While our children were attending their regular religion classes on January 7th, the adults were fortunate to have **Keki Dadachanji** address us on an extremely practical topic—Religion and Daily Life. A summary of his talk is given below for those of you who missed this interesting session.

Religion should guide us in our daily living. Two short prayers, ("Yatha Ahu Vairyo" and "Ashem Vohu") of the Zarathushti religion give us this direction. Reflection on the words of these prayers reveal deeper meanings. The same themes appear in other great spiritual traditions of the world, in remarkably similar language.

The central message of the "Yatha Ahu Vairyo" is that the path of Asha leads to illumination. The law of Asha is a spiritual law governing the universe, just as gravity is a law governing the physical universe. Various spiritual traditions call this law by different names (such as Tao), but the premise is the same. Following the law of Asha means working for the creations of the Lord. We should work for the creations of the Lord without expectation of any reward. Then the unasked reward will come to us in the form of "Vohu Mano", the "Good Mind".

"Ashem Vohu" tells us that following the path of Asha leads to "Ushta", the abiding joy. In Hindu tradition the "real" ("Sat") is that which does not change; conversely, anything that changes is not real. Things give us temporary happiness. "Ushta" is happiness that never changes, never leaves us. The final line of the "Ashem Vohu" prayer is astonishingly similar to the central lesson of the Bhagavad Gita: Do what is right; do not expect results. When we expect things to turn out certain way, we can be disappointed. "Ashem Vohu" says, follow the path of Asha without expecting any results, and it will bring to us abiding joy, like a shadow that never leaves.

In the current climate of religious disharmony it is comforting to see that all great spiritual traditions give us the same blueprint for daily living.


